ENDURING SIBLING RELATIONSHIPS

603

→ Primary source of socialization & learning → Impacts identity development & attachment → Increase in resilience → Reduced internalizing behaviors → Increased placement stability \rightarrow Offers protective factors across lifespan → Higher life satisfaction → Lower rates of depression





Siblings in Out of Home Placement

- 75% of children entering OOH placement have a sibling
- Up to 65% are separated from one or more siblings
- When parental rights are terminated, legal rights to siblings are severed
- Sibling separation may exacerbate traumatic effects of parental separation
- Sibling estrangement may increase as children move through foster care system

Camp Connect....Where it All Began in 2001



Modeled after Camp to Belong, a sib camp in CO
Local departments staff and volunteers
Only state funded sibling camp in the country; no cost for campers

Camp Connect Goals

- Memorable experiences that siblings share for a lifetime
- **Boost sense of competence and self efficacy**
- **Increase self-esteem**
- - Unique and positive experience with child welfare professionals and volunteers
 - **Decreased sense of isolation**



The "How"

- 55 campers divided into 6 'family groups'
- 3-4 siblings groups in each family and 4-6 counselors
- Families stay together for all daytime activities & meals
- All-camp activities each evening
- This year camp will require social distancing & masks
- Sisters share bunks with sisters, brothers with brothers
- 1.5 days of orientation for counselors pre-camp
 - 5 nights, 6 day camp experience

The "Who"

Counselors: local department staff, CASAs, attorneys, others interested in the welfare of children & partnership with the Naval Academy

What's in it for them: an unforgettable exhausting & exhilarating week

Campers

- Ages 7 17; only one sib needs to be in care others may be home, with a relative, or in an adoptive home
- COVID vaccinations required for those who are eligible
- High staff:camper ratio allows for close supervision
- Not equipped for physically or severely developmentally disabled children
- Statewide recruitment and programming managed by Baltimore County DSS and volunteers
- Deadline: July 1st apps to be forwarded shortly
